





Clearaudio Emotion



THERE ARE ONLY so many trenchant insights to be made about a product that's been as successful as this one. The Emotion is a double Product of the Year Award-winner, which means we've lauded its virtues many a time.

It's no hardship to do it over again, mind - the thrill of this Clearaudio is undimmed by time. Your money still buys the superb Emotion table, Clearaudio's Satisfy tonearm, and an Aurum Classics Wood cartridge.

Optional dust cover

Lately, Clearaudio has introduced a dustcover (not pictured) for the more houseproud owner - though at £84, it might take a little shine off what is otherwise a value-for-money masterclass. Mind you, any lingering financial doubts will be soon soothed away from the moment the Emotion emits a well-presented note.

With EMI's excellent, heavyweight pressing of Kate Bush's Aerial on the platter, the Clearaudio wastes no time in reasserting its credentials. It retrieves detail by the shovelful, organising it cleanly into the broad

finger-snapping in their immediacy and purity"

strokes of the material without fuss, and establishing a beautifully coherent soundstage. Rhythms, beats and tempos are finger-snapping in their immediacy and purity. In the midrange, voices are uncluttered, communicative and freighted with emotional impact, while low frequencies bubble or bang with bags of drive, yet without overhang. Also, from bass notes up to the crisp, attacking top end, information integrates impeccably.

The Emotion is an engaging and energetic listen, with deep-breathing dynamic ability and an equally refined side to its character. No recording is too complex, too tepid, or too thrusting for it to reproduce. It's a well-sorted, stylish device that makes music sound great.

Clearaudio Solution AMG package

CLEARAUDIO IS ARGUABLY the dominant force in high-end turntables. This German company makes the widest range of top-end decks, and supports them with a bewildering array of arms, cartridges and accessories.

There are far more expensive Clearaudios than this, but this package is still very much a full-fat version of what the manufacturer can do.

Beauty more than skin deep

The Solution is a family of products, with each version upgradeable to the next. The £1460 AMG marks the middle ground of the series. The Satisfy tonearm is an advanced version of that found on the Awardwinning Emotion deck (p38), and in this guise features a carbon-fibre arm tube and single-piece wiring from cartridge to amplifier. Completing the package is the Melody moving-coil cartridge, which has a body made of ebony and uses 24-carat gold coils.

The brand-name has it spot on: this turntable is a very clear, insightful and pure-sounding product. Take what might be the finest instrumentation.



ever put onto vinyl - Nick Cave's Babe, I'm On Fire - and this deck separates the instrumental jumble out deftly, finding space between notes that many can't.

This deck is fast, too. There's no sense of it hanging on to notes once they've

faded, all of which produces a clipped, precise and superbly well-timed presentation. Switch the musical menu to something grander, and the Solution package shifts gear too, producing a sound of immense depth, scale and space.

Flaws? Sadly, there are some. This Clearaudio is a little too restrained for our tastes. It hasn't got the punch to satisfy with the likes of Nirvana, or the bass power to deliver Bob Marley and The Wailers' Stir It Up with great conviction. Timing isn't that surefooted, either.

That said, we can see many going for the Solution's clean sonic presentation, and even more falling for the deck's striking looks. If you find yourself under its visual spell, give it a whirl.

Clearaudio Ambient/Satisfy/Concerto **** £4500

FORGET THE AMBIENT turntable for a moment: let's talk (once again) about Mr Nicholas Edward Cave. Along with his band, the Bad Seeds, he created Nocturama, one of 2003's great albums. Beautifully produced, it's one of our favourite test records.

And most testing of all, as we've already mentioned in our Solution review (left) is the closing track, Babe, I'm On Fire. At more than 15 minutes long, it's both an exhausting and an exhilarating listen.

Ambient creates order out of chaos

So what has this all got to do with Clearaudio's Ambient turntable, you ask? Well, played on the majority of hi-fi, Babe's rampaging bass, crashing cymbals, lashings of feedback and frantic vocals result in a chaotic soundstage, bass that jumps around like a toddler on a Sunny D diet, and treble that cut through week-old Stilton. Not good, in other words.

But play the same track on the Ambient. Complete with the £640 Satisfy Carbon Directwire tonearm, plus a splendid £1400 (yes, £1400)

delivers a performance as mighty as the music itself. From the mass of drums, guitar, percussion and violin, you can

pick out each instrument, note and nuance. However, this space isn't at the expense of integration: while the soundstage is wide and deep, the Clearaudio expertly knits together lower, middle and higher frequencies.

Of course, you might not listen to Nick Cave. No matter, this Clearaudio package loves all musical genres: Orff's Carmina Burana gets the dynamic reach and impact it deserves, while Christopher and Raphael Just's Popper 12-inch sounds more banging than a child with a hammer and a tin box. It's just wonderful!
